- Respect the professional status and wellbeing of the school staff.

As a parent, I have discussed these points with my child:

- Understand that I have rights and respect the rights of others by remembering the Tavistock Charter and taking care of myself, other children and my school.
- · Play nicely with other children.
- Respect the teacher by doing as I am asked.
- Try my hardest in class at all times.
- Respect others by being polite.
- Keep the playground tidy.
- Hang up my coat and book bag carefully.
- Behave responsibly in the toilets as I would do at home.

CHARTER

The Tavistock Charter

At Tavistock we aim to be a Rights Respecting School.

This means that we:

- Learn about the United Nations Convention for the Rights of the Child.
- Understand that we all have a right to learn and be happy.
- Treat each other with respect.
- Remember that it is our responsibility to look after ourselves, each other and our school.
- Remember the things we have agreed to do to help us all to achieve happily together.
- Stand up for our rights and those of others.

At playtime

Children and teachers have the right to a happy playtime. So we all have the responsibility to:

- · Keep the playground safe.
- Play carefully so we don't hurt anyone.
- Speak kindly to each other.
- Help the playground friends to do their job well.
- Keep the playground clean by putting rubbish in the bins.
- Stand still when the whistle goes and walk in sensibly when asked to.
- Remember how we have agreed to use the climbing equipment.
- Respect each others' feelings, especially if we are feeling cross.
- Understand that sometimes the right to playtime might be lost if we take other people's right to a happy playtime away from them.

In the classroom

All children have the right to learn and teachers have the right to teach. So children have the responsibility to:

- Try their best
- Let other children work without disturbing them.
- Speak kindly and politely to the teachers and other children.
- Do as they are asked straight away.
- Follow the rules that the class has agreed together for a happy classroom.
- Take part in opportunities to discuss how we can improve our school.

Teachers have the responsibility to:

- Make lessons interesting and enjoyable.
- Help children to understand how they can improve their work.
- Give children the chance to say how they feel and to make decisions about things that affect them.
- Work with children to make the classroom a happy and safe place.

Around school

Everyone has the right to enjoy coming to school, be safe and be able to learn. So we all have the responsibility to:

- Take part in assemblies, doing our best sitting, listening and thinking and allowing everyone else to do the same.
- Let others go to the toilet in private.
- Treat the toilets as we would treat our bathroom at home so that they are clean and pleasant for everyone to use.
- Keep everyone safe in the lunch hall by walking carefully.
- Eat politely without dropping food on the floor.
- · Remember to say please and thank you.
- Hang our coats and bags up and treat other people's things with respect by taking care of them as if they were our own.
- Say positive and encouraging things to each other.
- · Look after each other when we are sad.
- Work together to make sure we can all have pride in our school community.
- Be honest and trustworthy.
- Have fun together.

The school will do its best to:

- Ensure that "Every Child Matters" by teaching your child how to 'Be healthy', 'Stay safe', 'Enjoy learning and Achieve their best', 'Make a positive contribution' and ultimately 'Achieve economic well-being'.

- Respond promptly to your concerns.
- Be open and welcoming, offering opportunities for parents to become involved in the daily life of the school.
