GOVERNOR VISITS

A really important part of the Governor role is to carry out visits in the school. Visits help to keep Governors connected with the school and then we can see for ourselves whether the School Improvement Plan is being implemented. It is also important that certain critical checks happen regularly such as around safeguarding or the school's special needs (SEND) provision.

I have recently carried out two such visits – a SEND visit and a visit on the English Curriculum.

I met with the Head of English and was given a detailed overview of Reading and Writing. It is fascinating how much planning goes into the lessons and topics each term, and I was shown how the planning starts, how it turns into a lesson plan and how the results are monitored to ensure the best outcomes for your children. I also had the opportunity to look through some anonymised writing books including those at different levels, and it was useful to see how the planning comes to life in the pupil's work.

I met with the Special Education Needs Co-Ordinator (SENCo). This is an extraordinary role that co-ordinates the provision for all pupils in the school with special needs. The needs for SEND provision change each year, and throughout the year, as the needs of the pupils will be varied. It is particularly important to monitor the results of this support as progress may not be as fast as other pupils, but it is important that the best results are achieved with the right support.

I would like to assure all parents and carers that my visits demonstrated the excellent provision for your children by a school team that passionately care about supporting their best outcomes.
