# What have we been involved in?

#### Attendance

Nationally attendance has been very affected by the Pandemic. Whilst attendance is above the national average at 95.1%, there remains a focus on ensuring every child has their full entitlement to education and Governors have learned about the careful tracking in place to identify and support families where absence reaches a persistent level.

## Moving to a two form entry

From Sept 2024 school will be a two-form entry infant school. There is evidence from Hampshire County Council that census figures in Fleet are declining. Coupled with budget restrictions, we took the decision to reduce intake to a two-form entry of 60 admissions with September 2024 intake seeing this change come into full fruition.

Pupil premium is additional funding for school to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers. The PP spend can be viewed on the school website. Money is used for things such as clubs, swimming, book bags, ELSA and speech therapy. The Governor's monitor PP spend on a monthly basis.



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
